


Inspection Fee Reduction

- February 2017 – Minister Creed announced reduction in the Inspection Fee payable on Exports of Calves under three months of age
- Reduction from €4.80 to €1.20 per head
- Intended to bring about;
 - Greater equity in respect of fees payable per consignment
 - Improved competitiveness of Irish calf exports
 - Restored confidence in calf export sector





EU BOVEX System

- EU Regulations require paper passport for movements of bovines between Member States
- BOVEX = electronic data exchange between bovine databases through the TRACES system
- France/Belgium/Italy/Spain/Greece and Ireland
- Paper passports will no longer be necessary for exchanges between the participating countries during 2018 (date pending)



- Movement history




BOVEX Number of passports submitted in Q1-Q2 2017

Figure 1: Movement options permitted in the 29 days prior to export:



Modification to the residency check

- Standard regime – includes single movement via mart and/or dealer to assembly centre.
- Modification mid-2017: animal can move back to the same dealer from the assembly centre and return again to the same assembly centre
- Only applicable to dealers
- Only applicable between same dealer/assembly centre
- The 060 (residency) irregularity on AIM is now specified into one or more of 5 sub-categories (060A-060E)


Bluetongue

Turkey



- Complex sanitary requirements
- Multiple test requirements
- Multiple certificate types – time overlap
- Extension of validity period of “Old” certificates to 1/3/18 – main implication for Leptospirosis and pre-export TB testing



Algeria




- Changes proposed to the Algerian authorities to the agreed certificates in 2017
- Currently agreed Breeding cert and Males for fattening/slaughter cert
- Proposing 3 separate certificates
- Proposing changes to pre-export isolation (no period for slaughter cattle) – linkage with IBR requirements
- Ongoing close communication with Algerian authorities 2018




2017: EU Sheep Exports


2017: Overall Sheep Exports (slaughter/production)

Summary of movements:

Slaughter sheep



Slaughter sheep exports to EU

- Either direct to slaughterhouse or via one approved assembly centre in the destination country
- If not direct to slaughterhouse in destination country, movement from assembly centre there has to be within 5 days of arrival and under official vet responsibility
- France requires pre-validation of destination address indicated in slaughter certificates.



3rd Country Sheep Exports

- Challenging logistics
- Historical - Singapore
- Kuwait – agreed slaughter certificate in 2017
- Careful advance planning and close coordination with DAFM is necessary
